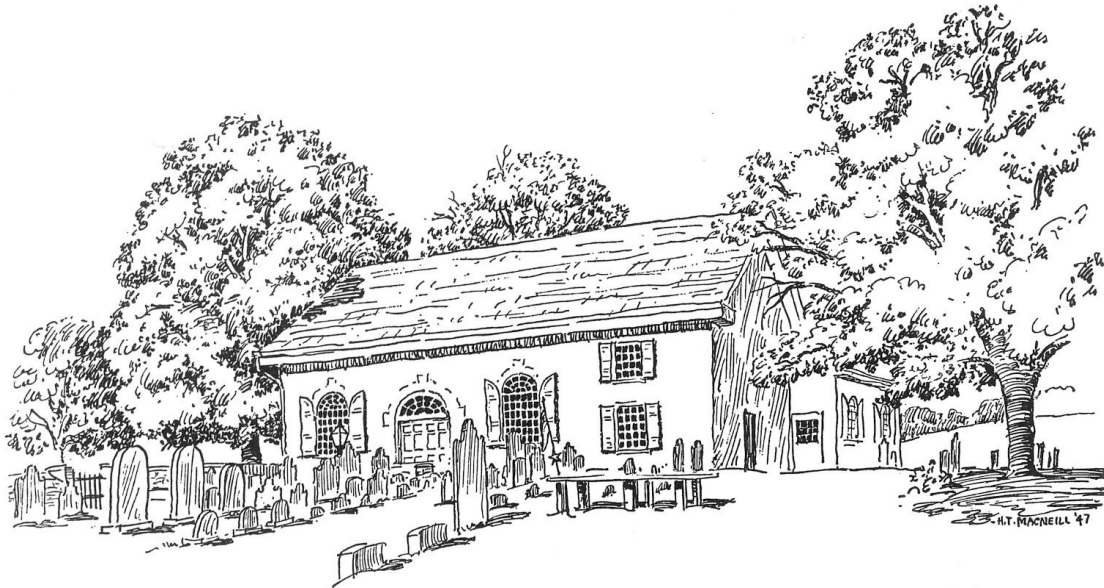

## **NOTES ON THE SERVICE OF EVENSONG**

Choral Evensong is the sung Anglican office of Evening Prayer which marks the end of the working day and prepares for the approaching night. The roots of this service come out of ancient monastic traditions of Christian prayer. In this form, it was created by Thomas Cranmer (1489–1556), Archbishop of Canterbury, as a combination of the offices of Vespers and Compline. The words of this liturgy have been set to music by some of the Church’s greatest composers.

In this service we are invited to reflect on the business of the past day, to pray for the world and for ourselves, and to commend all into God’s hands as words of Holy Scripture are said and sung. The beauty of the music is offered to help us set our lives in the light of eternity; the same light which dwelt among us in Jesus, and which now illuminates us by the Spirit.

This evening’s service is being sung by the Choirs of St. Peter’s Church in the Great Valley, under the direction of Dr. Bruce W. Glenny. Thank you to Liam Reid and Michael Trycieckyj for their skills in producing this service and to Mark Clark for providing additional drone footage. Thank you to a friend of St. Peter’s for the generous gift that allows us to offer virtually this beautiful and beloved Evensong.

## **NOTES ON ALL SAINTS’ DAY**

All Saints’ Day is classed in the Prayer Book of 1979 as a Principal Feast, taking precedence of any other day or observance. Among the seven so classified, All Saints’ Day alone may be observed on the following Sunday, in addition to its observance on its fixed date. It is one of the four days recommended in the Prayer Book (page 312) for the administration of Holy Baptism and this morning at St. Peter’s, we welcomed with joy a new Christian into our midst through the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.

On All Saints’ we remember all those who, having professed faith in the living Christ in days past, entered into the nearer presence of their Lord. All those whom we have loved, but see no longer. Worshipping in the box pews of the historic church many say they experience the presence of this “great cloud of witnesses.” (Hebrews 12:1) We look forward to being in those pews together again when we are able.
